Central point in the community to collect ideas

Consultation boards put in a central place for comments to be added



## Online meetings

Meet the project group and give views online

To door to door with semi-structured interviews or surveys



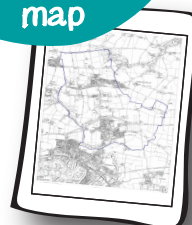
## Travelling tea room

## Interactive online digital map

Identify location specific issues on and online digital map



## Standing exhibition

Information boards in a central place for explaining the project



## Photo survey

Local photos to illustrate local issues and develop a community profile. What works well and not?



## Walkabout

Systematic walk through your area and others areas to observe and record key features



## Street stall

Take your consultation outside in an open space



Detailed household survey to capture views and test ideas

## Video soap box

Broadcasting opinion on camera (perhaps in a phone box)
